## CHAPTER 6: DESTINED FOR DIVINE ENCOUNTERS

“He will help you” (Psalm 37:5, NLT).

The word providence best describes the final phrase of Psalm 37:5. This is the simple last step to discovering God’s fingerprints in your life. This last step may be the hardest to accept, because there’s nothing left for you to do except to wait, watch God move, and look for His handiwork in your life. In Psalm 27:14, we are twice commanded to “wait on the LORD.”

**Question: How hard is it for you to wait on the Lord? Talk about a time in your life when you’ve had to wait on the Lord.**

Just before the Exodus, Moses exhorted the people of Israel to “stand still, and see the salvation of the LORD, which He will accomplish for you today” (Exodus 14:13). Waiting on the Lord is an act of faith; waiting can also be active. Perhaps God is asking you to fast and pray, or keep quiet and believe, or be still and stop working in your own strength.

**Question: What symbolic gesture of faith has God been asking you to make?**

You may still be asking, “How do I know where the hand of God is leading me?” God has graciously given us three beacons: the Word (objective standard), the Holy Spirit (subjective witness), and circumstances (divine providence).

When these three beacons are aligned, we can be assured that the directions we've received are from God.

**Question: Why do you think acting on one beacon without the others could lead you astray?**

As we conclude this study, remember to look for God's hand at work in your life. Remember the five fingerprints found in Psalm 37:4-5: delight in the Holy One; develop holy desires; dedicate your direction; depend wholly on Him; and discover your own holy moments.

**Question: If you have experienced some holy moments during this study, please share them with your group and glorify God together.**
